High School Curriculum

The academic program is organized on an eight period schedule that meets daily. The maximum course load for a semester is 3.5 credits; students take seven 51-52 minute classes and attend one 33-minute advisory period for no credit.

Dual Credit courses:

- College Algebra, Trigonometry, Statistics, Calculus
- College Composition I and II, Mythology, Public Speaking, Creative Writing, Short Stories
- General Psychology
- American History to 1865 / American History from 1865
- College Biology, College Anatomy
- Computer Applications, Microsoft Office Suite (MOS)
- Moberly Area Community College Online Dual Credit Classes (varies by semester)
- Missouri State University Agricultural Dual Credit Classes

Technical and Career Centers:

Hallsville High School students have an opportunity to attend an area career center to enroll in courses related to their career path. The majority of the students attend Moberly Area Technical Center and enroll in 3 credits for the academic year. When the student's program of study is only offered at Columbia Area Career Center or David Hart Technical Center, the district also has the means to send any eligible students to these two locations. Students attending area career and technical centers have an opportunity to earn Industry Recognized Credentials (IRC's) in their technical career field.
